WHAT IS HAPPENING IN READING WORKSHOP IN SEPTEMBER?

Mrs. Bradford & Mrs. Bushman (K) - Kindergarten will be introducing the components of reading workshop as we establish routines and build reading stamina. We will continue to read our fantastic interactive read alouds as we continue to build our excitement to become "Wild About Reading"!!

Ms. **Beer # Mrs**. **Stork (Ist)** - First Grade is continuing to learn and practice Reading Workshop procedures and build independent reading stamina. We are also starting our first unit of study: Learning and Playing Together at School.

Mrs. Boecker *Mrs. Kellerstrass (2nd) - We have been hard at work on our reading routines and procedures. It's amazing how much we have learned in such a short time, from choosing "Just Right" books to managing the whole classroom library, and from books talks to response journals. It's an exciting time to be on this new reading adventure together in 2nd grade!

Mrs. Davison & Mrs. Knox (3rd) - Third grade has been working on expectations and procedures for reading workshop. We are also building our reading stamina.

Mrs. Bishop * Mrs. **Zehr** (**4**+**h**) - We have been sharing ideas and using those ideas to create classroom charts. Some of the topics we have covered have been "Fake Reading vs. Real Reading", "Choosing a Good Fit Book" and "Thinking about Reading". We have been working hard to build our reading stamina too. In addition, we have been learning how to play word knowledge games that will be a part of our small group activities.

Mr. Finck #Mrs. Gingerich (5th) - In 5th Grade Reader's Workshop we are setting up routines. We are going "slow" to go "faster" later. We are making sure we all know what is expected during our independent READ READ READ time. The students are doing great with this. We have set up individual "book bins" full of good book choices for each student. Several students are volunteering to help organize our classroom library by genre. Benchmark testing begins tomorrow for individual students to read with Mr. Finck. Thank you in advance for your encouragement of your child to READ, READ, READ at home. Don't forget to encourage "Lunch Bunch" story reading at home to earn signatures for a lunch trip to Culver's!

Mrs. Scholl * Mr. Weyland (6th) - Sixth grade is using the Reading Workshop model to break down the novel, <u>The</u> <u>Giver</u>. We are doing mini lessons, small group talks, journal writing, and ending with sharing our writing.

MAP Testing

During the weeks of August 27th to September 14th all students will be assessed using MAP Testing, (Measures of Academic Progress).

MAP tests are used to determine your child's instructional level and to measure academic growth throughout the school year and from year to year in the areas of Reading and Mathematics. MAP tests inform instruction using valid, reliable and real-time data.

MAP tests are unique in that they adapt to your child's current level of learning. As a result, each student has the same opportunity to succeed and maintain a positive attitude toward testing.

There will be two more testing windows, (January and April/May). We will track student growth between each testing window. During parent-teacher conferences, teachers will be sharing the results of the first testing window.


STUDENT DROP-OFF / PTCK-UP

NOTE-Anytime your child is absent, you need to call the school to report the absence on our 24-hour line.


