TIPS FOR SUMMER READING

For children, summer is a time for relaxing and enjoying the pleasures of childhood. Here are some tips for making reading fun and enjoyable this summer, while also helping your child sustain reading skills:

- 1. Read aloud together with your child as often as possible! Make it fun by reading outdoors in the yard, patio, around town, or at the park.
- 2. Take books along on outings! You can enjoy reading anywhere you go this summer!
- 3. Take your child to the library! Participate in the library's Summer Reading Program or make a trip to the library to check out some new books.
- 4. Read the same book as your child and discuss it! This helps deepen your child's understanding of what he/she is reading and builds conversation skills.
- 5. Set a good example! Keep lots of reading material around the house and make it a point to shut off the TV and model reading behaviors for your child.
- 6. Allow your child to choose books for summer reading! Encourage your child to read about topics that interest him/her, look for new authors or series at the library, or listen to a new audio book.
- 7. Daily routines provide reading opportunities! Cooking, reading news articles, reading directions, or reading a brochure or article about a place you may be traveling during the summer can all provide authentic reading experiences.
- 8. Encourage your child to write about summer adventures too! Write a letter to a friend or teacher, mail a post card, or keep a journal to share summer experiences.
